VIOLENCE INTERVENTION PROGRAM

The goal of the Violence Intervention Program is to provide individual and group counseling, information and referrals, shelter, advocacy and accompaniment, 24-hour hotline service, crime victims' compensation assistance and education to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Quality services are provided to adults and children needing counseling, advocacy, and support in dealing with the traumatic issues that affect their lives. All services are free and confidential.

The Violence Intervention Program maintains working relationships with many community organizations. The Violence Intervention program hosts a multi-disciplinary task force to deal with the issues of domestic violence and sexual assault. Training is provided to law enforcement officials, medical personnel, teachers, human service agencies, clergy and community groups on the issues of child victims. Representatives from these groups also assist the program in providing training to staff and volunteers.

The Program's Outreach Education component makes presentations to elementary, middle school and high schools in school districts in Otsego County as well as students attending both colleges. Topics include healthy versus unhealthy relationships, date rape, sexual assault, incest, sexual harassment, personal safety skills, date rape drugs and the availability of community resources. The Outreach Education component also organizes the annual Take Back the Night march in Oneonta.

The program also receives funds from other sources, some are:

- New York State Department of Social Services Federal Family Violence Prevention Program to assist rural domestic violence victims with safe dwellings.
- Crime Victims Board to provide advocacy to victims of crime.
- United Way of Delaware & Otsego Counties for domestic violence shelter and sexual assault counseling.

The Community Maternity Services, (a member agency of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany), provides home-based support services to families and their children in Otsego County since 1971.

Services to Pregnant and/or Parenting Adolescents may include: Goal directed counseling, Childbirth preparation; Referral for pre/post natal care, Nutrition education, Advocacy for education, home based Parent Education, Residential care and Adoption services.

Services to families affected by HIV/AIDS: CMS provides home based services to families or caregivers affected by HIV/AIDS. This program is funded through the New York State Aids Institute. These services may include: Permanency Planning and Legal Services, Emergency Assistance, Parent Education, Making Memories and Therapeutic Recreation. These service are also home based.

Services are free and confidential, and are provided to families throughout Otsego County, either by self or agency referral.

LIFE SKILLS TRAINING

“Life Skills Training” is a comprehensive, research and outcome based prevention program that emphasizes proven skills training methods. It addresses all of the most important factors leading adolescents to use one or more drugs by teaching a combination of health information, general *Life Skills*, and drug resistance skills over a three year time period. The program is presented to the same students over three years. The first year’s curriculum is presented in 15 sessions, second in 10 and the third in 5.

This program addresses all of the most important factors leading to adolescent use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. Its goal is to reduce a variety of risk factors and provide skill that will reduce ATOD use in Young adolescents. With fidelity of implementation, Life Skills Training Program has been shown to reduce tobacco, alcohol and marijuana use by up to 75%.

D.A.R.E. OFFICER (DRUG, ABUSE RESISTANCE EDUCATION)

The Oneonta Police Department, DARE Officer position has been created to address the growing problem of adolescent drug use and abuse. The DARE officer is trained and certified by the NYS Dept. of Criminal Justice and serves as an officer trained to teach children drug abuse resistance education. This involves a 17-week in-school training course. The D.A.R.E. Officer instructs the curriculum through lessons lasting 45 minutes per week. The curriculum is designed to target elementary school children who are in the fifth and sixth grade. In doing so, they reach the children at a most impressionable age, addressing the issue of drugs, alcohol and tobacco use before most children have had their first experience with drugs. Employing a variety of activity-oriented

techniques, drug resistance lessons are taught to students through group discussions, role-playing, and a healthy exchange of ideas and feelings.

The D.A.R.E. Officer has direct contact with students of the elementary schools in Oneonta, Laurens, Morris, Schenevus, St. Mary's (Oneonta), Unadilla, Community Christian School (Oneonta) and Edmeston. The program actively encourages the involvement of the students' parents, school officials, educators, community and civic and fraternal organizations. Through just the basic curriculum, over 450 students in the above mentioned elementary schools are directly involved in the D.A.R.E. program and with the Oneonta Police Department yearly.

The outcomes of the program are a reduction in the supply of controlled substances as a result of reduced demand; a more positive identification of Police Officers by children and improved decision making by children in all life situations.

OTSEGO COUNTY YOUTH COURT

The Otsego County Youth Court was begun in the fall of 1998, initiated by the Otsego County Youth Board. Members of Otsego County Youth Court are students in county school districts. All have received the Youth Court training and have passed a Bar Exam. The Youth Court Coordinator, County Judge Michael Cocomma, Public Defender Otto Rothermel, District Attorney John Muehl and others provide training.

The Otsego County Youth Court is designed as a diversion program from the Family Court system. The main objective of the Otsego County Youth is to impact youth behavior through using errant Youth's peers as the judgmental body that judges them on violations of the law that the youth is accused of committing. The Otsego County Youth Court is designed to hear Juvenile misdemeanor and violation cases that would otherwise be sent to the Otsego county Family Court. Referrals to the Youth Court are made by the Otsego County Probation Department. All Youth Court positions, Judges, Defense Attorneys, prosecuting Attorneys, Bailiff and Court Clerk are positions filled by Youth Court members that are between the ages of 13 and 20. The Youth Court is judgment by peers. Prior to becoming a member of the Otsego County Youth Court prospective members are required to go through a training program and pass a BAR exam.

The Otsego County Youth Court is operated under the Otsego County Sheriff's Department. Sheriff Donald Mundy is the Executive Director of the Otsego County Youth Court. Skip Beijen is the Youth Court Coordinator.

An Executive Committee oversees the operation, rules and regulation. Membership of this Committee consists of the entire Otsego County Youth Board. A Steering Committee oversees the day-by-day operation of the Otsego

County Youth Court. The body of this committee consists of three adults and four Youth members of the Youth Court. This committee is also responsible for disciplinary action regarding members of the court.

PARENTING RESOURCE CENTER

The Parenting Resource Center provides services addressing needs for parenting skills through education and training courses, which are offered throughout the year. Through the Community Parenting group, it coordinates and provides continuous literacy and referral services. A calendar of scheduled parenting workshops is provided and additional family activities are provided to support family needs in these areas.

TOWN OF LAURENS YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

The overall purpose of the Laurens Youth Employment Program is to provide a summer work experience to youth ages 14-18. The workweek in the summer months is twenty hours, four hours per day, Monday thru Friday. The program focuses on helping youth obtain lifelong skills and productive employment.

Youth from the Milford area are beneficiaries of many unusual activities such as ROCK DAY, CHRISTMAS IN JULY, SANTA ON THE FIRE TRUCK, FUNNY OLYMPICS, hat and make-up day plus the annual picnic, which is always a big highlight. The Arts and Crafts Program is always filled, resulting in many items that the children can take home. Each day, some children go to the Clark Gymnasium for 30 minutes of swimming instruction plus 10 minutes of free swim. Organized activities and games, including whiffleball, kickball, tennis, basketball, soccer, softball, badminton, jump rope and others are provided. The Upstate Home for Children is also a part of this program. A day of horse rides has been inserted and is operated by Bobs Conveyance-wagons. Animal control includes petting the horses. Weekly programs and activities are done and distributed weekly. Program transportation includes swimming and home and return pickup by Milford Central School by contracts. The increased number of lower age children has made an increase in staff, now ten in number.
