

**LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2000
COUNTY OF OTSEGO, NEW YORK**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 4 OF 1999 -
ESTABLISHING PARKING RESTRICTIONS
FOR ALL COUNTY LANDS DESIGNATED FOR PARKING**

BE IT ENACTED by the BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE COUNTY OF OTSEGO as follows:

Section 1.

The following parking restrictions are established by the Otsego County Board of Representatives as they pertain to all parking areas of the County, including but not limited to such parking as is located adjacent to the Annex Building, Old Jail Building, Courthouse, County Office Building and Highway Department Buildings located in the Village of Cooperstown, New York, the Public Safety Building, Central Kitchen and The Meadows Facility located in the Town of Middlefield, New York, the County Office Building located in the City of Oneonta, New York, and parking on any other lands hereafter designated by the County.

1. Parking time limits where posted, as determined from time to time;
2. No overnight parking from October 1 through May 1 of each year where posted;
3. No parking in tow away zones where posted;
4. Handicapped parking - for handicapped permits approved by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles where posted;
5. No vehicles exceeding seventeen (17) feet in length allowed where posted.

Section 2.

The above parking restrictions as posted from time to time shall be enforceable by any qualified law enforcement agency. The County reserves the right to alter the above restrictions for any area by proper posting and with adoption of a Board resolution.

Section 3.

Violations of these parking restrictions shall result in a fine of \$10.00 for the first violation, \$20.00 for the second violation and \$50.00 for the third or subsequent violations thereafter, or the minimum fine set by the Vehicles and Traffic Law, whichever is greater.

Section 4.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgement shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof involved in the controversy in which such judgement shall have been rendered.

Section 5.

This local law shall take effect immediately.
